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## Kuala Koh, Taman Negara Kelantan



Taman Negara is the largest protected area in Malaysia. The Kuala Koh entrance is a popular destination for sport fishing enthusiasts due to the prized kelah (Malaysian mahseer) that inhabit the rivers here. Although fishing activities are tightly regulated in the park, day or overnight trips to a number of spots along the rivers can be arranged.

Apart from fishing, the pristine rainforests at Kuala Koh make it a great place for short treks, wildlife watching, or simply lazing about while listening to the sounds of the rainforest.

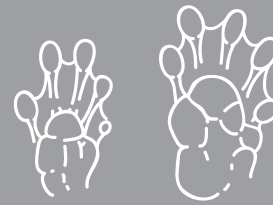

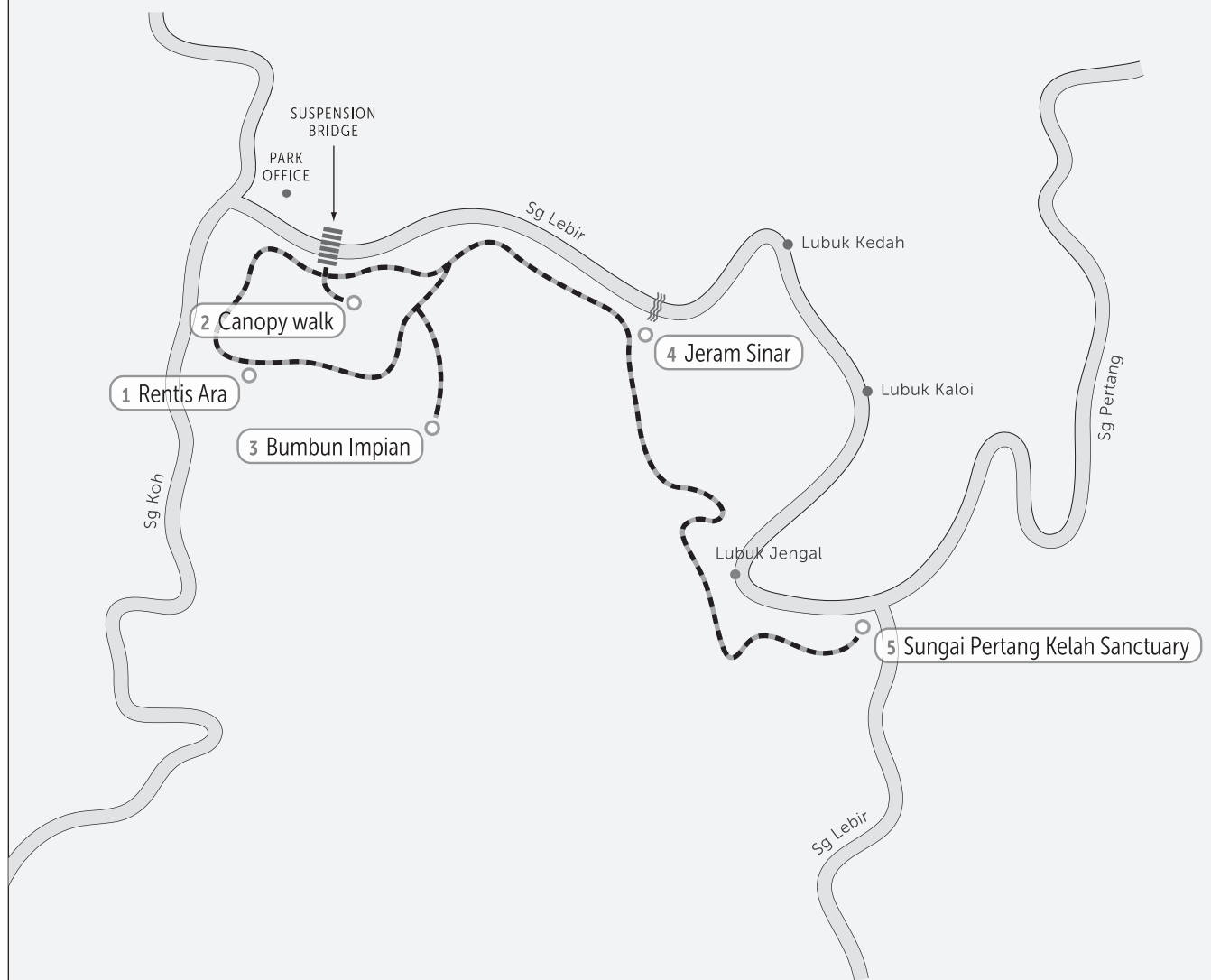
Animal tracks that you might see include:





## Kuala Koh trail map

Five trails are open to visitors. All of the trails start from the southern bank of Sungai Lebir, across the suspension bridge.



### 1 Rentis Ara

3 KM CIRCUIT

An easy walk over flat terrain that takes 1–2 hours to complete. Many species of fig trees, an important food source for many animals, grow along the trail. Footprints of large mammals such as elephants, barking deer and tapirs can sometimes be spotted here.

### 2 Canopy walk

300 M WALKWAY

The canopy walk, which is the fourth longest in Malaysia, begins near the start of Rentis Ara.

### 3 Bumbun Impian

1.5 KM FROM SUSPENSION BRIDGE



It is worth spending a night in this wildlife observation hide for the chance to spot animals such as barking deer, elephants and porcupines. The hide can sleep eight and is equipped with a toilet.

### 4 Jeram Sinar

2 KM FROM SUSPENSION BRIDGE



This small rapids along Sungai Lebir can be reached either by boat or a 1–2 hour walk. It is possible to return to the Park Office by tubing down the river.

### 5 Sungai Pertang Kelah Sanctuary

6 KM FROM SUSPENSION BRIDGE



Visitors can feed the surprisingly tame kelah fishes here under the supervision of park staff. The sanctuary can be reached by boat or jungle trail. The walk takes 2–3 hours from Jeram Sinar or 3–4 hours from the Park Office. The trail is moderately difficult, crossing low hills and small streams. There is a campsite and chalets for overnight trips.
